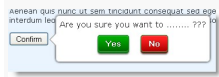


Jquery plugin : Fast confirm like javascript confirm

In my recent project, client demanded that confirm button text should be 'Yes' and 'No' instead of 'O' and cancel. I have gone through many forums posts and tried out many things to to change text of JS Confirm box button but didn't succeed. Even tried vbscript ([Stackoverflow Javascript Confirm](#)), but it didn't work in FF and Chrome.

Through Google I found a [jQuery Plugin Page](#) that lists all plugin that have been tagged with the term confirm. Wanting something fast and easy, I draw [Fast Confirm](#) as the name suggests it is extremely fast and easy to implement.

&lt;/html&gt;</pre></div><div data-bbox="82 789 916 803" data-label="Text"><p>I checked out the <a href="#">demo</a> and read through the <a href="#">docs</a>, within few minutes I had my jQuery confirm implemented, only problem faced while mimicking JS Confirm box was that there was no postback (I mean default event doesn't fire) happens when I click yes button (like it happens in JS Confirm box). To fire the event on click of Yes button I called __doPostBack function in onProceed function.
